# COMPLAINTS TO THE BBC: JANUARY 2009

The BBC answered over 48,000 complaints from audiences during January 2009. These ranged from a small number of complaints about potentially serious breaches of editorial guidelines through to a much larger collection of views about programme content. The key themes which emerged are as follows:

## **Complaints about BBC**

A large volume of complaints were received in response to the BBC's decision not to broadcast the **DEC Gaza Appeal.** A proportion of these were sent via online lobby groups.

In addition to this, a number of complaints were made about Jonathan Ross returning to the BBC, following his suspension.

#### Bias

Complaints were received about alleged bias in response to different News reports about aspects of the conflict in Gaza.

## **Offence General**

A number of people complained that offensive comments were made about an 80-year-old Spanish woman in an on-air exchange on Radio 2.

### **Violence**

A number of viewers complained that it was irresponsible to feature a gun and violence during an episode of *Waterloo Road*.
