Complaints to the BBC: January 2013

The BBC answered just over **14,500** complaints from the audience during January 2013. These ranged from a small number of complaints about alleged breaches of editorial guidelines through to a much larger collection of views about programme content and services.

There were complaints about the decision to reschedule Sunday religious programming on BBC Radio 2 to 6am, with Sunday Half Hour no longer being broadcast at 8.30pm.

We also received complaints from viewers of The Nolan Show in Northern Ireland who felt the political make-up of the studio audience was biased towards the Unionist/Loyalist viewpoint.

An episode of the Tweenies also attracted complaints from viewers who were unhappy that the character 'Max' appeared to be based on Jimmy Savile.
