Complaints to the BBC: June 2014

The BBC answered over **27,000** complaints from the audience during June 2014. These ranged from a small number of complaints about alleged breaches of editorial guidelines through to a much larger collection of views about programme content and services.

There were contacts from audience members who felt it was incorrectly suggested in some of our news coverage that a rise in reported cases of Crohn's disease could be attributed to having a poor diet.

We received complaints from viewers who thought it was inappropriate for Gary Lineker to wear an Italy shirt during the coverage of the Italy v Costa Rica match.

Some viewers were disappointed that the billed schedule was changed after World Cup matches ran into extra time, and finally we received complaints from viewers unhappy with some of our World Cup commentary.
