Complaints to the BBC: May 2013

The BBC answered just over **15,000** complaints from the audience during May 2013. These ranged from a small number of complaints about alleged breaches of editorial guidelines through to a much larger collection of views about programme content and services.

There were complaints about the **BBC News** coverage of the Woolwich attack from those who were unhappy that footage was shown of one of the suspected attackers making a statement.

There were also some complaints from those who felt there was too much coverage of Sir Alex Ferguson's retirement on BBC News.

Good Morning Scotland attracted concerns from viewers who felt Nigel Farage was treated poorly on the programme.

Finally, complaints were also received about the reference to 'terrible psoriasis' in **EastEnders** by character Poppy.
