

Complaints to the BBC: November 2014

The BBC answered just over **17,000** complaints from the audience during November 2014. These ranged from a small number of complaints about alleged breaches of editorial guidelines through to a much larger collection of views about programme content and services.

Topics raised included complaints about comments made by BBC Radio Norfolk presenter Nick Conrad while discussing the topic of rape on his show on 17 November.

We also received complaints from viewers who were disappointed that the result of England's Rugby Union match against New Zealand was revealed during the Scotland v Argentina match on 8 November before that evening's highlights show had been broadcast.

A Doctor Who storyline on 1 November dealing with death and cremation concerned some viewers who felt it was not appropriate for a family audience.

Finally, there were complaints about the use of two Dalmatian dogs during a dance routine on Strictly Come Dancing, also broadcast on 1 November.
