

Complaints to the BBC: November 2015

The BBC answered just over **15,500** complaints from the audience during November 2015. These ranged from a small number of complaints about alleged breaches of editorial guidelines through to a much larger collection of views about programme content and services.

Topics raised this month included complaints from people who felt that a storyline in Doctor Who, in which a plane was shot down, was insensitive in the light of recent real life events.

There were also complaints when Vanessa Feltz sat in for Radio 2's Jeremy Vine on the 30th October from listeners who felt an interview with a man awarded damages after experiencing homophobic abuse was unfair to him.

Finally, there were complaints about the Iain Lee show on Three Counties Radio from listeners who felt the host was unduly critical of two interviewees on the topic of homosexuality and the Bible.
