Complaints to the BBC: September 2014

The BBC answered almost 22,000 complaints from the audience during September 2014. These ranged from a small number of complaints about alleged breaches of editorial guidelines through to a much larger collection of views about programme content and services.

We received complaints from viewers who felt Nick Robinson's report (on the News at Six and Ten on 11 September) on the Scottish First Minister's press conference implied that Alex Salmond had not answered a question put to him.

There were also complaints when a technical issue meant that the National Lottery results were not updated on the BBC Red Button service.
